

Practice Medical Office Accessibility Policy

McGraw-Hill is committed to providing accommodations for students with disabilities to the degree allowed by Practice Medical Office (PMO). Areas addressed are:

- **Screen Reader Support:** PMO currently does not support screen readers.
- **Text Translation for Audio:** PMO does not include any spoken audio.
- **Caption Video:** PMO does not include any video content.
- **Information Presentation:** Information is presented in a clear and hierarchical fashion, and the navigation order is logical and intuitive.
- **Text Presentation:** Content in PMO is primarily text driven with visuals to enhance immersion. Visuals are not required to progress in the game.
- **Time Limits/Pausing:** PMO imposes no time constraints on the student and can be paused at any time.
- **Progress Saving:** Student progress is saved periodically in the service as they play and can be accessed from another PC or Tablet to resume play.
- **Flashing Content:** PMO includes some warm tone flashing graphics (intervals all less than 3 seconds).
- **Vocabulary Support:** Standard language is used for most of the game. Certain parts of PMO use specific medical terminology and abbreviations as part of assessing student knowledge.
- **Navigation Support:** There is only one game driven change in focus in PMO, when the student first enters the game and is prompted to enter their name. There are no pop ups or other potentially disorienting elements in the navigation of the game.
- [Coming Soon]: **Mouse Free Navigation:** PMO is completely usable without mouse. The user interface supports tabbing between elements and use of the enter key to select and element.
- **Color Contrast Ratio:** The game does not use color as the sole means of conveying information. [Coming Soon]: PMO complies with the recommended 3:1 color contrast ratio for text presentation.
